"FAMOUS ORCHESTRAL PLAYERS XXXIX - JOHN BRDGE. When Manchester was most consistently radical in its politics, it was held to be most conservative

in its music. And, though Sir Hamilton Harty has made its music progressive, it remains true that, in a peculiar way, Manchester audiences dislike changes in the personnel of the Halle Orchestra. It will seem strange to many patrons of that orchestra to see any figure other than that of Arthur Catterall in the position of leader. But it is certain that no change would meet with their approval so heartily as the promotion of John Bridge from the position of deputy leader. He is by way of being a Halle institution. He first joined the orchestra for the season of 1893-94 and he has not missed a season since. Only one member of the orchestra can claim a longer period of service than he. For several years he has been established by the side of the leader and the change can, indeed, appear even to him to involve no considerable upheaval in his habits. Thus Sir Hamilton Harty is assuring to himself that his new leader shall be both experienced and popular. It is alleged that a Lancashire motto is 'hear all and say nowt'. John Bridge was born in Bury in that county and certainly exemplifies the 'say nowt' part of the admonition to perfection. Many orchestral players are difficult to persuade into talking about themselves. John Bridge is just impossible so to persuade. Fortunately we know enough of him to make his talking unnecessary. Richter thought highly of him and invited him to play at Beyreuth. It was not possible for him to accept, but he played with Richter at Covent Garden during several seasons. He was one of the few provincial players who were included as honorary members of the London Symphony Orchestra for the purpose of its tour of the United States with Nikisch in 1912. He led the orchestra at Harrogate for four years, but has become a familiar leader at Llandudno during the last ten summer seasons. Many will learn with regret that his new position involves his resignation from the popular Catterall Quartet. He has been a most valuable member of that combination since its foundation and, if many have been dazzled by the brilliance of Arthur Catterall or the virtuosity of Johann Hock, many have had penetration enough to appreciate the stirling worth of the capability and dependability of John Bridge. Wherefore, we are enabled to offer congratulations to the new leader and the orchestra which he will lead simultaneously". Musical News and Herald, 18th July 1925
